



Learn About Your State

Legislature

- When does the legislative session begin and end? Do they meet every year?
- How many representatives and senators?
- Are they full time or part time?
- Which party controls each house?
- Who chairs education committees?
- Are there interim education committees?


State Education Leaders

- What is the governor's role in the state chief and state board of education?
- Is the state chief appointed or elected?
- Who does the state board report to? Appointed or elected?





State K-12 Governance Structures

Tips for Engaging with State Leaders

- Don't make assumptions about the person or their level of experience, perspective, etc.
- Remember that policymakers have different experiences, depth of knowledge about topics, backgrounds, etc.
- Remember that most state leaders are involved because they care about issues and the people they serve.
- Ask questions in difficult conversations or to avoid giving your opinion.
- When discussing policy issues, remember that policymakers are balancing competing interests.
- Be open to building relationships in unlikely places.
- Build relationships outside of "the ask."
- Tell stories.

What are potential unintended consequences?
