Making the Key Connections: Teaching Strategies That Promote Student Learning, Motivation, and Retention

Wednesday, Oct. 30, 11:45 a.m.-2:00 p.m., SUB Ballroom C

Research-based, cross-disciplinary teaching and learning strategies will be discussed in relation to how to infuse engaging, student-centered pedagogy into traditional classroom instruction, and how to increase student motivation. Attention will be given to making four key connections: (1) the student-instructor, (2) the student-course, (3) the student-student (peer), and (4) the student-campus. Practical strategies for making these connections will be grounded in and supported by foundational principles of human learning and student retention.

Presenter: Dr. Joseph Cuseo, professor emeritus of psychology, Marymount College, CA. An international speaker, Dr. Cuseo has authored numerous articles and books on effective teaching, advising, student retention, and student success.
