- Highlight the durable skills that remain essential in an AI-powered world, such as critical thinking, problem solving, creativity and communication.
- Invite professionals as guest speakers.
- Design assignments that encourage reflection on academic and professional growth.

The adage, "Students don't care what you know until they know that you care," remains as relevant as ever. When students feel recognized, supported, and challenged, they are more likely to understand the purpose of their education and persist toward their goals.

As the semester begins, let's remain attentive to the influence we have on students' confidence and sense of possibility. MSU is a transformational place for students because of the daily

investment of faculty and staff. Thank you for that commitment and for being an exceptional colleague.
